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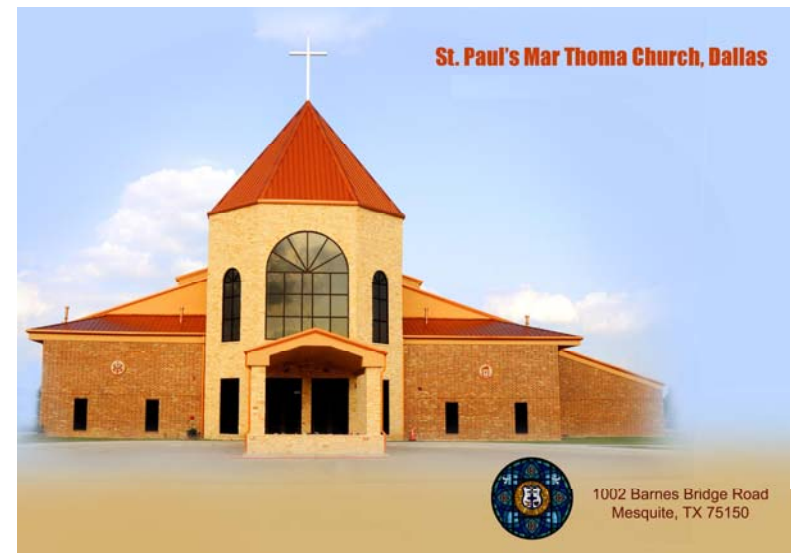

Youth Chaplain's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



“I’m the angel food cake angel. I bring you peace, hope and comfort food.”

“I have no one to help me...” (St. John 5:7). Have you caught yourself saying this? Is hope a reality in your life?

It sometimes seems that when our struggles and trials in life become so great that instead of growing in faith we begin to lose hope. Yet, hope is the very essence of our Christian faith and life. It is this faith that we profess when we proclaim that God sent his only begotten Son Jesus Christ, who died, resurrected, ascended into heaven and will come again to receive His Church. It is this faith in Jesus Christ that must eclipse the darkness of our pain and anxieties. When we lose hope we may go through a process of self-loathing and see our problems as bigger than our God.

In St. John 5:1-10, Jesus meets a man who had been an invalid for 38 years! When Jesus speaks to him, his words reveal that he had lost hope in others, in himself and in everything. In fact, his lack of hope and faith blinded him to see Jesus as God who stood before him. Yet, Jesus demonstrated His power and healed the man by making him to walk and forgiving his sins. That is, what seemed like an insurmountable burden of 38 years was lifted in a matter of seconds! When we are at our lowest state and are losing hope remember that Christ is nearby and is willing to comfort and restore! Trust in Jesus Christ and grow in faith so that our problems do not become greater than our God. He is more than sufficient!

I'd like to share a story of hope I read earlier this week:

“About 20 years ago there was a house near the entrance of our subdivision that kept their Christmas lights burning long after the season was past. They burned through January. Even through the first of February those outside lights burned every night. Finally, about the middle of February I became a bit critical and said, “If I were too lazy to take my Christmas lights down, I think I'd at least turn them off at night”. But about the middle of March there was a sign outside of their
