FAITH AND PRACTICES OF THE CHURCH: A Study Series.

Identity of the Mar Thoma Church.

It can be explained mainly in three statements:

1. We are St. Thomas Christians having the tradition of St. Thomas the apostle of Jesus Christ.
2. We are one of the Lesser Eastern Churches which was established in the Eastern part of the World.

We are Reformed Church. Main emphasis of Reformation :Christ only, Scripture only and Grace only for Salvation.

Characteristics of Eastern Churches and Basic Faith.

1. Faith is based on its Worship and Liturgy.
2. God is transcendent, infinite, uncreated and is a mystery who cannot be defined fully in human language.
3. God is Triune God - three persons in one Godhead and mutual indwelling of three persons.
4. Church is the faith community and person is located within the community. Family is the basic community. Community is more important than individuals while the Western Churches are more individualistic.
5. Sacraments are means of receiving God`s grace through which salvation is possible.
6. Jesus Christ is fully human and fully divine.
7. Salvation is not an one time redemption, but is a growing experience in faith.
8. Mission of the Church is witnessing to God`s activities rather than converting to the Church.
9. Eschatological understanding is that God will fulfill the history according to God`s purpose and it is not an apocalyptic drama.

2. It is a mission oriented Church. Spreading of the Gospel is our goal. The laity has an important role in the mission of the Church and all the members are considered as evangelists. The whole Church is the Royal priesthood of Christ.
3. Mar Thoma Church is known for its social outreach. It runs education institutions, orphanages, destitute homes, hospitals, rehabilitation for the disabled, social development programs and mission fields.
4. It is an independent Church with democratic administration based on its constitution and representative bodies. It has an ecumenical orientation and world wide communication with other Churches and ecumenical movements.
